Following a very busy Autumn and Remembrance period, Christmas with additional services and events is now upon us and St Mary's has once again not just coped but risen to the challenge of welcoming visitors and worshippers in increasing numbers. The church is very welcoming with nativity and Christmas star decorations from many contributors. Thanks to those who decorated and those who contributed.

The Field of Remembrance services saw the involvement of school children singing 'Make me a channel of your peace', many people laying wreaths, visiting to pay respects, taking part in prayers, the reading of names and tolling church bells. A spectacular and much appreciated effort from everyone involved.

Visitor numbers were just over 300 for October and November, a continued recovery post-Covid. The visit of Bishop Viv at the end of October showed appreciation for the whole conservation project and marked an exciting new beginning in the life of the church post-project.



The prayer tree has also been in constant use with a series of shaped cards, hearts, butterflies, poppies over summer and autumn and now 'Christmas Angels' help people express thoughts and feelings and offer prayer in difficult times.





School visits looking at Tudor history in November and in December for carol services have allowed around 250+ children to share in the beauty and 'specialness' of the church. We will also probably have one or two additional openings during February half term.

Our Christmas Carols and High tea event was very well attended and enjoyed by our volunteers (18 in total) with much delicious food and chatter (we were the last two tables to leave).

There have also been a couple of group tours from Lydiard House and it is hoped to build on these in 2023. A lot of interested people come to enjoy finding out more about the church, it's history, amazing artifacts and recent conservation.
